

Elizabethtown Creek – West Ranch Project

DESCRIPTION:

This rehabilitation project, implemented in October 2002, consisted of designing and building new creek drainage, using 350 feet of pond and plug in the gully, and re-directing flow into a well vegetated remnant channel and over the floodplain (5 acres), and installing a multiple culvert system. Re-vegetation work and monitoring continued post-project from 2003-2006. The project site serves as a mitigation and conservation area for the temporary and permanent impacts to wetland and riparian habitat as a result of Caltrans Quincy Road rehabilitation project. Other major partners were Plumas County and the West Family Ranch.

PROJECT RESULTS:

In 2007, Caltrans hired a subcontractor to survey the site and make a wetland determination to satisfy state requirements as a successful mitigation project. As a result, no further monitoring is required.
